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WHY HAVE A PLAN

In September 2016, the St Catherine of Siena Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) was established.

Whilst the immediate focus of the Council was on formulating the operating guidelines and council organisational matters, the PPC recommended to Fr John Tollan (Parish Priest at the time) the development of a Parish Pastoral Plan as a priority.

The Parish had existed and grown for 10 years prior to this initiative, largely through the efforts of our clergy, our parish administration team and a dedicated group of parishioners. For the parish to move towards its potential, the PPC reasoned in line with the old adage

"IF YOU FAIL TO PLAN, THEN YOU PLAN TO FAIL"

and encouraged greater parishioner involvement and ownership in the development of the Parish Pastoral Plan and its subsequent implementation.

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3. THE PROCESS UNDERTAKEN

- i. The Parish Pastoral Plan Task Group was established by the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC).
- ii. All members of the PPC completed a questionnaire providing their views on the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT) of/to the parish. The input was then consolidated.
- iii. Fr Richard became Parish Priest, restarted the PPC, reconfigured the Pastoral Plan Task Group and added his input to the Task Group.
- iv. Parishioners were invited to submit their own SWOT of/to the parish which were then consolidated with those of the councillors.
- v. A parish meeting was held to present and discuss the SWOT results. A draft SWOT was published on the website and feedback invited.
- vi. Draft Vision and Mission statements were developed and published on the website and feedback invited.
- vii. Pastoral Category priority rankings were established from councillor and parishioner submissions. These were consolidated, published on the website and feedback invited.
- viii. Councillor and parishioner input and feedback were used to develop the Pastoral Category oriented GOATs (Goal, Objective, Action, Timeline).
- ix. The Pastoral Plan was assembled, approved by the PPC and presented to the parishioners for discussion and feedback.
- x. The total time taken for the development of the Pastoral Plan was 27 months, with most of the progress made in the last 17 months.
- xi. The Pastoral Plan is intended to cover the next five (5) years, but it is a living document that can and will change as our needs and environment vary from time to time.
- xii. In conjunction with Fr Richard, the PPC will oversee the implementation of the Pastoral Plan. The progress of the implementation will be reviewed every year in June.

5. OUR MISSION

To achieve our Parish Vision, we will:

- Energetically rejoice in and openly express our faith.
- Warmly welcome everyone, and nurture and foster greater involvement.
- Enthusiastically celebrate the Eucharist.
- Actively immerse ourselves in the life of our Parish activities.
- Joyfully proclaim the Gospel of Christ.
- Compassionately serve the needs of others.
- Lovingly cultivate and strengthen fraternal bonds in our Parish Community.
- Inspire, motivate and empower people as parish leaders.





6. STRENGTHS, WEAKNESSES, OPPORTUNITIES, THREATS (SWOT)

Note: An item could appear as both a strength and a weakness or as both an opportunity and a threat. They are neither right nor wrong, they are the consolidation of the opinions submitted.

- STRENGTHS: The Parish is enhanced by:
 - a) Dynamic and diverse multicultural community, deeply focused on historically traditional Catholic up-bringing and teaching.
 - b) Masses and Liturgical services are generally well attended by Parishioners who are reasonably serious and dedicated about living out their Faith and commitment.
 - c) Stable core of longstanding parishioners who are extremely dedicated in sharing their gifts and talents in leadership and service of the various ministries and activities.
 - d) Newly appointed, energetic and enthusiastic, Parish Priest, supported by a Deacon/pastoral associate and long-established parish staff.
 - e) Strong foundation of active ministries, which plays a significant role in building the faith and life of our Parish.
 - f) Strong sacramental programs enhancing the faith community.
 - g) Young, vibrant, growing, community.
 - h) New, modern and contemporary Church building centrally located.
- WEAKNESSES: The Parish is diminished by:
 - a) Loss of stable clergy.
 - b) Exclusiveness and lack of cohesion and collaboration in our ministries, which restricts participation and parishioners' inclination to volunteer.
 - c) Lack of effective outreach, evangelical, charismatic, faith, and spiritual formation programs.
 - d) Lack of participation in Parish events.
 - e) Disconnect between the Parish and the school communities.
 - f) Limited sources of income.

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- g) Poor parish identity within the church and the wider community.
- h) Parish is not seen to be welcoming enough and lukewarm engagement with fellow parishioners.
- i) Minimal engagement by parishioners apart from Mass attendance.
- j) Lack of statues and icons in the church or worship space.

OPPORTUNITIES: There is an opportunity for:

- a) Establishment of more ministerial groups, building upon the core diverse base of committed and gifted regular parishioners.
- b) Occasions of social gatherings and parishioner bonding.
- c) Greater interaction and outreach with Parish schools/college, disengaged families, youth and the local lapsed Catholic Community.
- d) Expansion of revenue sources.
- e) Growth of the music ministry outside of liturgical parameters.
- f) Investment in the younger generation.
- g) Education and spiritual growth.
- h) Astute utilisation of technology and social media.
- i) Ministering to a growing community.

• THREATS: Limit the negative or inhibiting effects of:

- a) Vibrancy of alternative religious organisations.
- b) Continuing attachment to previous Parish Communities.
- c) Negative image and publicity of the Catholic Church.
- d) Low priority given to religion and spiritual life.
- e) Belief that medicine, science and technology can meet all spiritual needs.
- f) Stagnation in the knowledge and the practices of the Catholic faith.
- g) Natural resistance to change.
- h) Affluent society.
- i) Government policy.

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


7. PASTORAL CATEGORIES

Note: After significant input from Parishioners adding to PPC submissions, the Pastoral Categories were ranked in order of importance. They are listed below from the most important down to the not quite as important. All Pastoral Categories are integral to the Pastoral Plan and all are addressed in it.

- Spirituality & Faith Formation to nurture people spiritually in their community and help to growing their faith – prayer groups and bible study groups, teachings, missions, retreats – Lent & Advent reflection days and sacramental preparation courses – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)
- 2. <u>Liturgy</u> the celebration of the Eucharistic and other services to ensure conscious, active and full participation from all present the choice and arranging of readings, music and liturgical rites at every service the prudent use of artistic elements to enhance the beauty of the Worship Space.
- 3. <u>Welcoming & Hospitality</u> to ensure the Parish is somewhere people can feel comfortable where they are treated in a fair and friendly manner where they can always ask for help if needed where there is always a smiling face and a friendly greeting to give a warm welcome to regulars and newcomers alike.
- 4. **Community Building** to build relationships amongst Parishioners to energise and stimulate vitality in Parish management, programs and activities to foster a deeper sense of belonging and strengthen identity as a Parishioner to generate greater enthusiasm for participation in Parish programs and activities.
- 5. **Evangelisation** to spread the Good News in the local community to witness to the Gospel by being a good example to others to build relationships with lapsed Catholics and people of other denominations and faiths to utilise sacramental programs, social events and outreach services to spread the Word.
- 6. <u>Leadership</u> by both ordained and secular to play key roles in Parish vitality to inspire, motivate and empower people to participate actively in Parish life to work collaboratively for the development of community.
- 7. <u>Outreach</u> to provide service and assistance to the wider local community to form links with government agencies and community groups, e.g. Caritas, Catholic Mission, SVDP to support the needs of overseas community through funding for building projects, education and other development needs.










